## How to Take Good Pictures of Anything

Taking a photo of something is a good way to keep memories safe from being forgotten.

However, just because it is a picture of something cool, doesn't make it a good picture.

It is a good idea to document things that are interesting or rare, but try to make it the best you can. The main reason some pictures are good and some are bad is for one reason. Lighting.

Lighting can make or break a good photo. When dealing with complex geometry, it can be difficult to figure out where to stand and at what angle. The main goal is to have the sun at your back, and not in front of you. If you shoot towards the sun, the sky will be blown out and very bright, while the subject will be dark and grainy.

There is a way to make the subject look good when backlit. By increasing any brightness settings, the subject can become well-lit. However, the sky will be an absolute lost cause... I would only recommend doing this if the image is for documentation purposes, and that you aren't trying to create a good looking picture.

Having a good frame is very important as well. Having the subject taking up most of the frame is usually the way to go. However, if the scene is interesting, zooming out and sacrificing clarity of the subject may be the way to go. For example, given a train going through a river valley, you would want some of the scenery in frame with the train as well, because it gives the location a chance to shine.

## How To Go Storm Chasing

While there is no one way to go storm chasing, this is how I do it and I'll tell you about it. First, the days before I plan on going storm chasing, I look at forecast models from the Storm Prediction Center to see if any certain areas in particular look good for the development of severe storms specifically supercells. Once I find a favorable enough outlook, I continue to follow up the coming days before the chase. That is the perfect scenario, but most chases are last minute, day before or hours before as the weather is unpredictable. Second, it's the day of the chase, I check weather models constantly as they update by the hour, seeing if the ingredients are coming together for supercell production. Once you're on the storm I have to make sure to watch out for storm direction so I never get caught up in it, keep weather the radio on, and watch the radar and warnings too. Basically, you need to continue to monitor the storm as chasing whilst in the middle of all of that, taking videos and pictures and just enjoying watching the power of mother nature.

Let me break it down in 6 easy steps:

1. Check weather forecasts days before chasing.
2. Pick a storm and continue to monitor.
3. Get to the area you want to chase in.
4. Make sure you know the direction the storm is moving.
5. Watch radar, listen to weather radio, and following warnings.
6. Have fun & be safe.

While there is no perfect way, the best thing I can say is be safe and become a trained weather spotter first before you go storm chasing, or educate yourself.

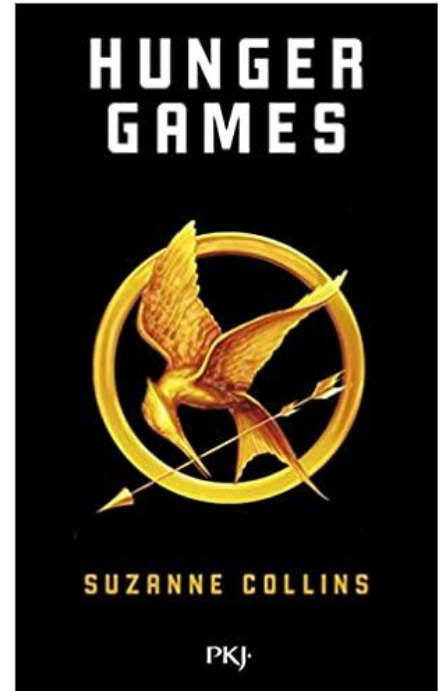

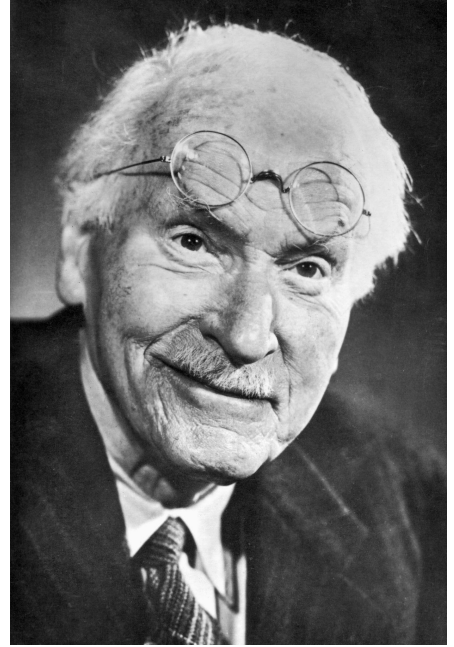

## Who Was Carl G. Jung? (July 26, 1875 - June 6th, 1961)

Carl Gustav Jung was a Swiss psychiatrist, psychoanalyst, and *founder* of analytical psychology. During his time working in the Burghölzli hospital, he stumbled upon the founder of psychoanalysis: Sigmund Freud. The two had a similar correspondence together and over the next six years their vision would only become a catalyst for a profoundly new paradigm within psychology and perspective as a whole. Their collaboration would take a turn when Jung publicly criticized Freud's own theory of the Oedipus complex and emphasis on infantile sexuality. Jung would later go on to develop *analytical psychology*, which is perhaps one of the most profound relations ever made about perspective. Throughout his lifetime, Jung would write and publish many of his personal works, most of which are self illustrated, and are still being published to this very day.



Jung's school of thought is truly unique because it shows the relation of symbolism between the individual unconscious and the collective mind. In fact, it makes the effort to bridge the understanding we have of ourselves to the collective mind we share.

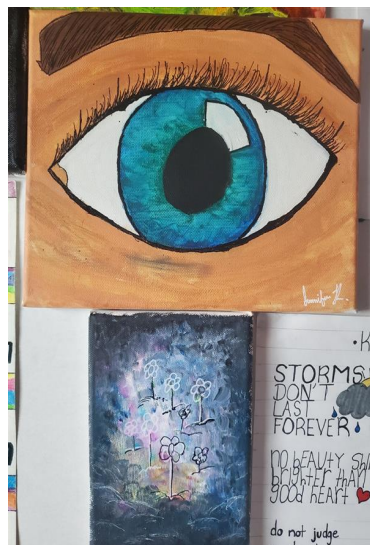
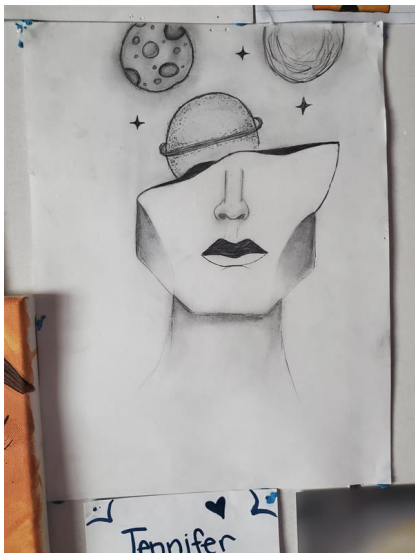

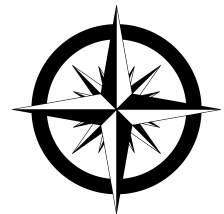
