Safe2SpeakUp is an application on all LMHS student school-issued computers that allows a student to report something unsafe or to ask for help for a personal crisis for self or someone else at any time. Safe2SpeakUp alerts are sent directly to LMHS Administrators, Student Assistance Counselors and School Counselors. Thanks to some hard work and efforts by some of our LMHS students, we now have a QR code and a link that can be used more easily for student reporting. Construction Impacts to Parking Begins after March 8 – PARKING ALERT

March 8 will be the last school day we will use the West (Door #1) parking area (14 parking spaces, 10 ADA parking spaces, 4 district vehicle spaces). It will also be the last day for some time that we will use the western-most area of the South Parking Lot (approximately 71 parking spaces). Please be aware that these locations will no longer be available when we return from spring break on March 18. Additional ADA locations are planned to be added near the Door #2 and Door #14 areas. The Door #1 and Door #16 circle drive area, as well as the western-most area of the South Parking Lot, will be fenced off beginning after March 8. Emergency egress will be maintained; however, it will not be a regular entrance/exit location for the remainder of the construction project.

Proof of Immunization for Meningococcal

All Iowa students 16 years and older must meet the following immunization requirement *prior* to the first day of 12th grade:

• 1 dose Meningococcal (A,C,W,Y) vaccine received after age 16 years.

Please provide proof of immunization to the health office. A religious exemption is also acceptable.

Other Information

Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL)

Registered voters <u>who reside</u> in the Linn-Mar CSD are eligible to vote ahead of the special election on **Tuesday**, **March 5**.

From now until Monday, March 4, in-person absentee voting is available at the Linn County Auditor's Office (935 2nd Street SW, Cedar Rapids). This option can be completed weekdays from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. A valid ID will be required to vote.

On the ballot is the Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) renewal for Linn-Mar CSD. The voted PPEL must be renewed every 10 years and provide revenue that has been used to address facility and equipment needs throughout the district. This list includes roof repairs, school bus replacement, technology purchases, school security improvements, and more. More information can be found on the <u>district website</u>.

If the voted PPEL is renewed, it will remain in place through 2035 at the existing rate of \$1.34 per \$1,000 of taxable property value. This will generate approximately \$3.5 million to \$4.7 million annually, based on the district's taxable valuation increasing by 3.5% each year.

If you plan to vote on election day (March 5), the polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. You will need to show a valid ID and polling locations can be found on the <u>Iowa Secretary of State website</u>.

Linn-Mar Aquatic Center Swim Instructors Needed:

All applicants must be 14 years of age or older. Spring lessons will begin on Monday, March 18.
