#### Attendance Information as you look at PowerSchool

After three weeks of working through the Attendance reporting changes, we want to provide some important information as a follow-up to many questions received in our Attendance Office. Please note that calling your student out from school does not mean the absence will automatically be exempt.

#### These are frequent **Exempt** Codes in PowerSchool:

- "SRP" is a school related participant (this replaced "S" from previous years). Only exempt for participants, not spectators.
- "MEDX" The new state law states that the MEDX code can only be used for students "unable to attend school due to legitimate medical reason(s)" and a doctor's note will satisfy this requirement. Notes can be turned in by the student to either the attendance office or the counselor's office. They can also be emailed in to the Attendance Office.

#### These are frequent **Not-Exempt** Codes in PowerSchool:

- "ILL" -Illness, used when calling out sick or for a doctor's appointment, is not exempt until a Dr's note received.

  The **only** way for a medical appointment to be exempt is with a doctor's note. Notes can be turned in by the student to either the attendance office or the counselor's office. They can also be emailed in.
- "FAM" -Family Leave, used for vacation, funerals, family emergencies, car problems, or overslept.
- "CV"- College Visit.
- "DOT" (when a student goes to the vehicle licensing location) is not considered exempt.

#### Daily Attendance Messages To Start Being Sent Each Day

LMHS will begin to send out an email and text message to parents twice each day should your student be absent without prior parent notification during that day. If a parent contacts the Attendance Office prior, then you should not be receiving the email or text notifications. These email and text notifications will be sent to parents at 12:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. each day. While the notifications are part of meeting the state requirement for attendance, they are not related to the categorizing of a student absence. The school will continue to make in person calls in an effort to notify parents as soon as possible of absences without parent notification.

#### Serious Threat-Intruder ('walk-through only') Drill on Tuesday, September 10, 2024, at 9:01 a.m.

On Tuesday, September 10, at 9:01 a.m. LMHS held a Serious Threat-Intruder 'walk-through only' Drill. The **focus** was **knowing** what to do and where to go. The following is what was emphasized by staff during the drill:

#### Point I: Get out of the Building.

For the drill, students will be walking outside as a class with their teacher emphasizing:

- It is important to simply get out of the building as quickly as possible.
- If there is a logjam getting out a door, go to the next closest door the point being to not wait to get out and to find the next quickest exit and get out of the building.
- If you cannot leave the building, then barricade and prepare to fight. [will be discussed when return to classroom].

# Point II: <u>Get off Campus</u>. [For today, classes will **stay put just outside of the building**. **Do NOT leave campus**]. Teachers will be emphasizing the following with students:

• Once you get outside of the building, get off campus any way you can. (Do NOT get in your vehicles. Emergency vehicles will be coming on site and traffic will snarl).

### Point III: Go to the MARION YMCA for reunification.

Teachers will be emphasizing the following with students:

- Once you get off campus, you should make your way to the MARION YMCA (go west on Tower Terrace to get there).
- Please point in the general direction (northwest) of the MARION YMCA.
- Let them know that the busses will take students from the MARION YMCA to the District reunification site.
- Teachers will ask if any questions.
- Upon return to classroom, teachers will emphasize with students what to do if need to 'Barricade and Prepare to Fight'.

# **Point I:** If you must, <u>Barricade and Prepare to Fight</u>, as you work to get out of the building. After returning to classroom, teachers will be emphasizing with students:

door(s) to prevent, or at least disrupt, anyone from entering the room.

The focus is knowing what to do and where to locate vourself in the classroom.

- 'Barricade': Teachers will show students what items they would like students to help quickly move in front of classroom
- 'Prepare to Fight': Teachers will show students where they will locate in room once they have barricaded doors. (Students will be asked to spread throughout the room and locate behind desks/tables/etc. and away sightline of someone outside the door(s)). Teachers will inform students to 'arm' themselves with any objects that they can use to throw/distract any perpetrator that may penetrate the barricade.
- 'Get out of the room and out of the building': Teachers will inform students the goal is still to get out of the room and out of the building as they are able. If perpetrator has been distracted/disabled enough to get out of the room, do so quickly and then get out of the building at the nearest exit.

## Tornado Drill held on September 12

The second Tornado Drill of 1<sup>st</sup> semester was held on Thursday, September 12. All students and staff were in shelter locations in just over three minutes. (We had a delay in the radio report from one area but have learned students were in position earlier than the radio report). This is our final Tornado Drill of 1<sup>st</sup> Semester. We will start doing our two 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester Tornado Drills in mid to late February.

#### **Construction Update and Traffic Caution**

A large crane will be in the Door #10 circle drive on September 24, to put to new HVAC units on the roof. The Door #10 circle drive will be closed off for a while on this day.

The pre-cast walls of the new performance hall will start being staged and set on September 26. Flag crews will be in the South Lot/10<sup>th</sup> Street entrance/exit during the day to help stop traffic. Semis will be staging off campus and arriving as walls are put into place. Another large crane will be on site as the precast walls are placed. The semis will coordinate and enter the fenced area in the South Lot, then back into the construction area during this time. The contractors know our class schedule to help minimize any delays. If you are entering/exiting while the semis are entering or exiting the South Lot and the construction zone, you may experience some short delays. This will take a few days, and any planned schedule is subject to change at any time.
