

PHYSICAL PLANT & EQUIPMENT LEVY

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is PPEL & what can these funds be used for?	→ A voter-approved levy that generates funds a school district can use for infrastructure and equipment repairs, purchases, and improvements and must be renewed every decade.
Why is PPEL important to our district?	→ The Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) is the main revenue source that supports infrastructure investments and equipment needs.
Does PPEL change my property taxes?	→ Linn-Mar currently has the \$1.34 voted PPEL levy in place through June of 2025. The District is asking for a continuation of this levy through June of 2035.
How long has Linn-Mar had a voted PPEL?	→ According to the Department of Management records that date back to 2003, Linn-Mar CSD has had a voted PPEL since then. It's possible it dates back previous to 2003 but we don't have records to confirm that.
How many districts in Iowa have PPEL?	→ 276 out of 325 districts in Iowa have a voted PPEL.
Why is the school board requesting the voters to renew PPEL now?	→ It is the main revenue source that supports infrastructure investments and equipment needs. The voted PPEL, by law, is good for a maximum period of 10 years and this levy, at Linn-Mar, will sunset in June of 2025 without it being approved by voters.
What might happen if PPEL is not renewed? What "bucket" will maintenance come from? What might need to be sacrificed?	→ If the PPEL is not renewed, the district would need to use general fund or <u>SAVE</u> dollars to support building infrastructure needs, transportation, and technology, delaying potential projects planned from SAVE funding.

There is a state grant of \$50,000/building for security improvements and evaluation, what upgrades are you considering past these funds?	→ The \$50,000 is per building and cannot be pooled. First step will be to assess recommendations from evaluation for each individual building and then prioritize per building what to apply the \$50,0000 grant money toward. After that we would need to assess what security improvements are needed per building to bring them all to the same level of security.
Why was March 5 selected for the special election date?	→ Election dates are set in Iowa Code.
Is it a simple majority vote?	→ Yes, it is a simple majority vote.
Is this just to approve a continuation of the current rate with no rate change or more cost to the taxpayers?	→ Yes, a continuation of the current PPEL rate for 10 more years.
