# The Six Triple Eight Battalion – (2/19)

The Six Triple Eight Battalion, officially known as the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, was a unique and groundbreaking all-Black female unit of the United States Army during World War II. Established in 1945, the Six Triple Eight Battalion was created to address the mail backlog for American soldiers stationed in Europe. The women in this battalion were tasked with sorting and delivering mail. The battalion consisted of over 800 African American women, many recruited from across the United States. They faced the dual challenges of racism and sexism during their service. The unit was deployed to England and later to France, working tirelessly to ensure that soldiers received their mail. They operated under challenging conditions and were instrumental in clearing a backlog of nearly 17 million pieces of mail.

The Six Triple Eight Battalions were celebrated for breaking barriers and paving the way for future generations of women and people of color in the military. Their service highlighted the contributions of African American women during the war, which had often been overlooked. For many years, the contributions of the Six Triple Eight were not widely recognized. Still, in recent years, efforts have been made to honor their legacy, including proposals for awards and public recognition. The story of the Six Triple Eight Battalion serves as an important reminder of the vital roles played by women and minorities in the military and their contributions to the war effort.
